

300 vs. 400-Level Courses

Beginning in the fall semester 2012, most THE courses will be offered on a 300 *and* a 400-level. Both designations satisfy the University Core requirement for an "upper-division" theology course. Courses under the 300 designation are intended for students taking their third theology course in fulfillment of the University Core requirements (i.e., the vast majority of students). The 400 designation is intended for theology majors, minors, and other students with a special interest in theology. They do not entail more work, but provide assignments more suited to students interested in theology beyond just the Core requirements.

THEP courses carry either a 300 or a 400-level designation, depending on the needs of the cross-listed discipline. The number does not indicate that one is harder than the other. Both are considered "upper-division" courses.
