## **Activities Fair**

## **A.H.D. / H.D.**

Assistant Hall Director / Hall Director.

## **The Anchor**

A coffeehouse style study space available in Haggerty Hall where you can enjoy a latte or gelato.

## **ASUP**

Associated Students of the University of Portland, the student government. If you're a full-time undergraduate student, then you are automatically a member.

## **BC**

Buckley Center. Contains many classrooms, campus department, and faculty offices.

## **BC Aud**

Buckley Center Auditorium. Adjacent to BC, this is the largest classroom on the Bluff. After hours, the space is used for various films and programs.

## **The Beacon**

The on-campus, student-led newspaper published every Thursday.

## **The Bluff**

Referring to the geographical feature upon which the campus is built; it is also a nickname for the campus.

## **Capstone Project**

Refers to the senior projects, thesis seminars, and recitals, which many seniors (and a few juniors) complete as a highlight of their academic program(s). In the spring of each year, on Founders Day, there are many public presentations of such projects, which are open to all students and faculty to go and attend.

## **C.A.S.**

The College of Arts and Sciences; the largest, most populated academic program at the university.

## **Coffeehouse**

An occasional Friday night mini-concert or variety show where students get to come and experience free live entertainment, coffee/Italian sodas, and food all in the comfort and convenience of St. Mary's Lounge.

## **The Commons**

The Bauccio Commons is the on-campus dining hall for both students and faculty to enjoy.

## **Core Curriculum**

Courses that every student is required to take, and are designed to make sure you receive a well-rounded education.

## **The Cove**

Wraps, burgers, sandwiches, salads, and more! This on-campus food service option opens early and closes early when classes are in session.

## **CPB**

Campus Program Board is a major branch of ASUP. This student organization is dedicated to bringing social and cultural events to campus.

## **C.S.C.**

The abbreviation for Congregatio Sancta Cruce, the Congregation of Holy Cross, the religious order that has served the University of Portland since it was founded in 1901. Also referred to as "Holy Cross."

## **D.O.D.**

Dance of the Decades. The major spring semester dance, where everybody dresses up in a costume from his or her favorite decade.

## **Encounter**

The Encounter with Christ Retreat; a popular retreat offered every semester by the Office of Campus Ministry.

## **Espresso UP**

A weekly Wednesday night program from 7-10 pm in St. Mary's Lounge. You can enjoy free espresso drinks, Italian sodas, and the occasional musical performance, all sponsored by Student Activities and ASUP.

## **Founders Day**

It is when the University pauses to celebrate its rich past and its promising future. In recognition of the importance of both the past and the future, the University holds no classes on a Tuesday in April and instead opens its doors to all to learn from the best and brightest students.

## **Freddy's**

Fred Meyer, your one-stop shopping center down the street from the University.

## **Home Base Group**

A group of students who share a seminar-style workshop class together during their first semester at UP.

## **Information Services**

Responsible for academic and administrative computing, networking, telecommunications, information systems, web services, infrastructure, and technical support.

## **KDUP**

The student-run radio station that can be heard on 1580 AM and on the web at KDUP.up.edu.

## **The Log**

Much like how river pilots keep a log of their daily activities, we keep track of what happens each year. The yearbook comes out early in the fall of every year, and is compiled and edited by students.

## **L-P Center**

The Louisiana-Pacific Tennis Center. You'll need reservations.

**The Max**

Portland's light rail transit system, which connects the eastside to the city.

**Officers**

The President, the Provost, and the Vice Presidents of the University, which form the primary leadership team for UP.

**Ohana**

A pre-orientation, multicultural retreat for incoming freshmen.

**P.A.D.**

Pilots After Dark. Weekly events put on every Saturday night by Resident Life staff for everyone to enjoy.

**Padre**

Schoenfeldt Hall. Padre was Fr. Schoenfeldt's nickname; a long-time member of the UP community and to whom the hall is named after.

**The Pearl District**

Just north of downtown Portland, it is home to many art galleries, restaurants, and Powell's City of Books.

**P.H.E.'s**

Peer Health Educators-they're students who help assist students with health-related information.

**Pilot House**

A central meeting place located right off the main parking lot. It houses the bookstore, the Cove, the Information Desk, and a campus ministry outreach office. The Pilot House is a 24-hour study space.

**Pilots**

The nickname of our students, alumni, and sports teams.

**Points**

Create an account with Bon Appetit food service and you can use your ID card to eat anywhere on campus...as long as the money lasts.

**PORTLAND Magazine**

The University's quarterly magazine, published by the Office of Public Relations in Waldschmidt Hall.

**P Plant**

Physical Plant. The on-campus maintenance team, whom will help you with all your on-campus maintenance problems.

**Pride Slide**

Essentially a large slip 'n slide, covered in purple paint, and will usually happen before important soccer games.

**P Safe**

Public Safety. Our campus security officers who will help you with your various safety and security needs.

**Purple Pride**

A student group on campus that supports Pilot athletics.

**Quad(s)**

Grassy areas near a group of buildings. For example, the grass near Shipstad is called the Eastside Quad, while the grass between Franz Hall and the Chapel of Christ the Teacher is called the Academic Quad.

**R.A.**

Resident Assistant. They're available to assist students with any issues they may have with life in the halls.

**R.C.C.**

Resident Computer Consultant. They're available to assist students with their computer and telecommunication problem in the halls.

**Regents**

Members of the UP's Board of Regents, the men and women legally responsible for the University's operation and mission.

**R.H.A.**

Resident Hall Association. They are students from each resident hall, whom are all part of their particular hall's Hall Council, and come together to collaborate on hosting different events put on by the resident halls.

**ROTC**

Pronounced "Rot-see." The Reserve Officers Training Corps. A branch of the U.S. military. AROTC is Army and AFROTC is Air Force.

**Rose Quarter**

An area of Portland, which includes the Coliseum and the Rose Garden, where big-name concerts and professional basketball games are played. Not to be confused with "the" Rose Garden, i.e. the International Rose Test Garden up in Washington Park, a fabulous, actual rose garden.

**Service Plunge**

A pre-orientation opportunity for incoming students to volunteer with local service agencies.

**S.L.U.G. Garden**

The Student Led Unity Garden. The garden is located just off-campus behind Field and Schoenfeldt Halls.

**S.J.C.**

Service and Justice Coordinators. Students who coordinate direct service opportunities within the resident halls.

**St. Johns**

The neighborhood northwest of the university at the end of the North Portland peninsula.

**Swan Island**

The Island just south of The Bluff where the shipyard is located.

**Tri-Met**

Portland's public transit system. Schedules are available at the Campus Information Center and in the public safety office.

**23<sup>rd</sup>**

NW 23<sup>rd</sup> is a quaint Portland neighborhood filled with many restaurants and shops for you to explore.

**UP Connections**

A peer mentorship program.

**The Village**

Haggerty and Tyson Halls. These halls are the two non-traditional, apartment style housing accommodations available on the UP campus.
