

It's how we become closer: to each other and to the full, purposeful future that lies before us. All in an effort to better this world and find our place in it.








THAT'S WHEN WE WONDER.



Because as you wonder about the world around you, it's just as important that you step directly into those real-world experiences — whether that's in ecosystems or healthcare systems, in a school or a multi-national business, in a tech start-up or local government. Whatever catches your curiosity, we want you to find yourself right in the middle of it, and to direct your discovery toward something that speaks to you.

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
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YOU MIGHT FIND SOMETHING







You'll take an Anchor Seminar your first semester as an introduction to both the core and college life, followed by Foundation courses in the arts, sciences, social sciences, and humanities, and two additional Exploration courses outside your major to delve deeper into the habits of the heart and mind. A final Integration project will help you reflect upon what you learned in the University core and its connections to your major.
