## FOUNDED

1901 and guided by the Congregation of Holy Cross.

## UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT BODY

**3,352** full-time undergraduate students from 47 states and territories, 28 countries

**70.5%** of students from outside Oregon

**28%** identify as first generation

**50.1%** self-report as historically underrepresented.

## 2023 FIRST-YEAR CLASS PROFILE

Middle 50% SAT score of 1220 to 1380; middle 50% ACT composite score of 27 to 31; average unweighted high school GPA of 3.70. SAT and ACT scores are optional.

Semester program locations include Austria, Australia, France, England, Ireland, Spain, and Italy (UP financial aid applies). Locations vary for summer

programs and short-term, faculty-led programs but could include Ecuador, Malawi, Japan, and the Dominican Republic.

## SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID

For 2022-23, the average amount of aid awarded to full-time, first-year students from all sources was \$36,596, excluding loans.

## TUITION, HOUSING & MEALS

For the 2023-2024 academic year, tuition is \$54,400, average on-campus housing is \$11,136, and food (meal plan 2) is \$5,400.
