FOUNDED

1901 and guided by the Congregation of Holy Cross.

CAMPUS LOCATION

150 acres. Adjacent to the Willamette River, minutes from downtown Portland.

STUDENT BODY

3,797 undergraduate and 456 graduate students from 50 states and territories and 41 countries; 74% of students from outside Oregon; over 40% of undergraduates self-report as historically underrepresented (based on race and ethnicity).

2019 FIRST-YEAR CLASS PROFILE

Middle 50% SAT score of 1160 to 1330; middle 50% ACT composite score of 23 to 29; average unweighted high school GPA of 3.65.

FACULTY

252 full-time professors; 11:1 student/faculty ratio. Majority of classes under 30 students.

ATHLETICS

Club, intramural, recreational, and 16 NCAA Division I sports (men's baseball, basketball, cross country, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field; women's basketball, cross country, rowing, soccer, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, volleyball, and beach volleyball).

RESIDENCE LIFE

Ten residence halls, which house more than 2,200 students. More than 90% of first-year students live on campus.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Nearly 100 student clubs from academic to special interest to club sports. Other ways to get involved: student government, Campus Program Board, Diversity and Inclusion Programs, Pilots After Dark, our student-run online news source, yearbook, and radio station. STUDIES ABROAD

Summer, semester, and year-long programs in places such as Australia, Austria, Cambodia, Ecuador, England, France, Ireland, Italy, Japan, New Zealand, Rwanda, Slovenia, South Korea, Spain, and more.

FINANCIAL AID

Average amount awarded to first-year students last year was \$27,456, excluding student loans. Nearly 99% of full-time undergraduates receive some type of aid.

TUITION

For the 2020-2021 academic year, tuition is \$49,424; room and board (most popular package) is \$14,196.
