How might your worldview change when you encounter diverse communities and explore socio-economic and social issues up close and in person? The University's *Moreau Center for Service and Justice* offers a variety of service opportunities, including immersion experiences in urban and rural areas in the U.S. and abroad. You might work with people experiencing homelessness in downtown Portland or migrant workers on a Northwest farm. You can explore issues of immigration on the U.S.-Mexico border or trace the Civil Rights movement and its impact on current issues of racism and classism on a tour through the South. For those who want to explore international concerns, immersions take place in South America and Africa.

Where in the world can your interests and aspirations take you? You might find yourself conducting professional-level research with UP professors in Spain (as part of an archaeological expedition) or as part of an REU (Research Experiences for Undergraduates) at one of the many universities nationwide that participate in the program. You might find yourself working for a nonprofit, government agency, or local business in such places as Australia, Hawaii, or all along the West Coast. Recent internships include positions with think tanks in Washington, D.C.; the Denver Museum of Nature and Science; NASA; Nike; PACCAR, and Indian Health Service.

Through specific coursework, studying and living abroad, and proficiency in a second language, you will be ready to work on global issues and you will receive a World Citizen certificate from the *Sojourner Scholars Program*. Or enroll in the *Global Perspectives in Leadership* course, which brings together classwork with a month-long international immersion and community/social justice outreach. Recent destinations include New Zealand and South Africa.

At UP, diversity, equity, and inclusion are valued and supported through programs like *Diversity Dialogues* and the *UP Connections program*. Our student clubs include more than a dozen focused on diversity and culture like the Hawai'i and CHamoru' clubs, Latinx and Black student unions, the Filipino American Student Association and the Native American Alliance, among many others. The *Office of International Student Services* offers special programs and support for those adjusting to life in the U.S., and the *International Club* organizes events such as International Education Week to promote cross-cultural understanding.
