CLOSING

COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

Rev. Gregory J. Boyle, S.J.
Los Angeles, California

Gregory Boyle, SJ, is the founder of Homeboy Industries, the largest gang-intervention rehabilitation, and re-entry program in the world. Now located in downtown Los Angeles, Homeboy Industries has been replicated by more than 250 organizations, in locations as widespread as Idaho, Scotland, and South Africa. Each year more than 10,000 former gang members from across Los Angeles come through Homeboy Industries' doors in an effort to make a change in their lives. As Fr. Boyle writes in his second book, *Barking to the Choir*, "Homeboy wants to give rise not only to the idea of redemptive second chances but also to the new model of church as a community of inclusive kinship and tenderness." Some of those second chances come in the form of an 18-month job training program—Homeboy Industries runs a bakery, a café, farmers markets, and businesses in electronics recycling, catering and silkscreening. Sometimes the second chance comes from the removal of a tattoo (Homeboy removes about 3,000 per month). But mostly the second chances come from the healing, tender community, where people are encouraged to delight in one another the way Fr. Boyle is convinced God delights in every one of us. By keeping his feet firmly planted with the

marginalized, Fr. Boyle finds that the margins melt away. He typically brings his homies with him to speaking engagements and in doing so centers the stories of their wisdom and experiences. Their wisdom is hard won—Fr. Boyle has buried close to 250 individuals due to gang violence—and Homeboy employs four therapists (and 49 more who volunteer) to walk with individuals trying to overcome a childhood of poverty, addiction, violence, mental illness, or deep trauma. Fr. Boyle sticks to his Ignatian roots when he speaks of finding God in all things, most especially in the community of homies he calls his colleagues, friends, and neighbors. (One of his homies is his spiritual advisor.) He initially grew to know East Los Angeles as pastor of Dolores Mission Church, when it was the poorest parish in the city and gang violence was particularly high, but in this space he found God. "We are sent to the margins NOT to make a difference," he writes, "but so that the folks on the margins will make us different." Fr. Boyle has received the California Peace Prize, the 2008 Civic Medal of Honor from the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, and was inducted into the California Hall of Fame. He is the author of *The New York Times* best seller *Tattoos on the Heart*.

CHRISTUS MAGISTER RECIPIENT

Sister Marilyn Lacey, R.S.M.
Menlo Park, California

Sr. Marilyn Lacey, RSM, thought she would enter the convent and have a relatively quiet life where she would teach high school math and things would line up as neatly as an equation. But, as she says, “God had other plans.” These plans initially stemmed from an index card tacked to the convent bulletin board: “Urgent! Refugees arriving at SFO from Southeast Asia. Volunteers needed at the International Terminal.” This was 1980, and at the time she had never met a refugee. She went to the airport, led refugees to connecting flights, and also began a new focus and mission: working with and becoming a welcoming presence to refugees. She spent time in a Thai refugee camp, earned her master’s in social welfare, and served for two decades as director of refugee and immigrant services for Catholic Charities of San Jose, California. In 2008, Sr. Lacey founded Mercy Beyond Borders, a nonprofit that forges ways for women and girls in extreme poverty to learn, connect, and lead. The organization works in South Sudan, Malawi and Haiti, and in refugee camps of Kenya and Uganda. She asks her staff of fewer than 24 to be a “compassionate presence,”

especially to those in refugee camps, by affirming their strengths, encouraging them, offering hope as well as practical services. The average stay in a refugee camp is 15 to 20 years. In South Sudan, Mercy Beyond Borders funds Saint Bakhita School, the only all-girl boarding school in the nation, started by a South Sudanese bishop who got buy-in by speaking to families one by one, asking them to allow one daughter to come and learn to read. Enrollment started with a dozen girls beneath a tree; now it’s over 800. The power of education has slowly chipped away at a dowry culture that devalues girls. Sr. Lacey believes in the value of listening to the marginalized. “God promised,” she says, “to hang out with the least among us. So, going to the margins...that’s my best chance of encountering the Holy One.” In 2001, she was honored in person by the Dalai Lama as an “Unsung Hero of Compassion.” In 2017, she won the global Opus Prize for inspirational faith-based leadership. She is the author of *This Flowing Toward Me: A Story of God Arriving in Strangers*. “We are all one,” she says. “And it matters how we treat one another.”

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

Carlos Kalmar
Portland, Oregon

“What does Oregon Symphony do? What does Oregon Symphony stand for?” These are the questions Carlos Kalmar, music director of the Oregon Symphony, has contemplated for the past 18 years, as he and his team have worked to make the symphony a part of the fabric of the community it serves and reflects. “We decided, many years ago, that our footprint in the community had to change,” he says. “We wanted to work for and with the community, to continue to work for the well-being of the community.” He has also brought recognition to the symphony beyond the Portland environs, including a highly acclaimed Carnegie Hall debut with the Oregon Symphony Orchestra. The recorded album from this concert, *Music for a Time of War*, was later nominated for a Grammy award. He also received Grammy nominations for *Spirit of the American Range* (2015) and *Aspects of America: Pulitzer Edition* (2020). Along with his orchestra, he has worked hard to bring new music to the community. He is not a conductor who specialized in one area of music or with one composer. “I don’t like to repeat things,” he says. “I like to learn new things; I like the rush of figuring them out.”

When he brought Pink Martini to play in concert with the Oregon Symphony, he even got up onstage—“Of course!” he says—to sing vocals with the group. During what would have been his final season (COVID-19 cancelled the season), he had scheduled a series called the *SoundStories*, exploring the question: “Who has the right to be heard in our society?” and featuring works from an Austrian Jewish composer who fled the Nazis, among others. A native Spanish and German speaker, Kalmar was born in Uruguay to Austrian parents (his own family members had fled Austria due to Nazi threat). He started with the violin at a young age, and switched to conducting after they moved to Austria when he was in high school. He has been a regular guest conductor with major orchestras in America, Europe, and Asia, and has served as the chief conductor and music director for some of the most renowned orchestras in Europe. He will continue his longstanding position as artistic director and principal conductor of the Grand Park Music Festival. His influence on the city of Portland—on its vast cultural and artistic fabric—are a part of his legacy.

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

Carol Ann Mooney
South Bend, Indiana

The transformational value of an all-women's education, the Holy Cross mission, and a reverence for the law are the threads that have bound Carol Ann Mooney's career in higher education.

Eventually, these values led to her 12-year tenure as president of Saint Mary's College, an all-women's institution founded by Holy Cross sisters in South Bend, Indiana. She was the first lay alumna to serve as president. She learned to love the law early on while working as a secretary for a law practice in upstate New York, the dairy-farm country where she grew up. She likened the experience to being the only doctor in town, and the way the lawyer treated clients made an impression on her: "I saw him treat the farmer and the millionaire with equal dignity and care. I was blown away by how he could help people. He was my inspiration." After completing her bachelor's at Saint Mary's College, she went on to graduate first in her class from Notre Dame Law School. She then worked for a law firm in Washington, DC, until she and her husband decided to move back to South Bend to raise their growing family. One Sunday morning at Mass at Notre Dame, a former professor noticed her and asked first: "What are you

doing here?" And second: "Do you want to teach at our law school?"

In 1980, Mooney embarked on 24 years teaching and administering at Notre Dame's Law School.

Her areas of expertise are trusts, wills, and estates, as well as Federal Court procedures. She has co-authored two books on these subjects. She received the law school's Teacher of the Year award in 1983. Appointed by US Supreme Court Justice Warren Earl Burger, she served in an advisory role to the Judicial Conference of the United States. She also grew in her leadership responsibilities during this time, serving as both assistant and associate dean of the law school, then vice president and associate provost of Notre Dame from 1996 to 2004. In 2004, her decision to lead Saint Mary's College was, for her, a no-brainer. "When you care about something, and you have skills that could help move it forward, leadership makes sense." During her tenure she started three graduate programs, significantly increased the number of first-generation students, and successfully increased the endowment during the Great Recession. "Real leadership comes out of love," she says, "love of mission, love of organization, love of the people."

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

Gil Muñoz

Portland, Oregon

Gil Muñoz, Chief Executive Officer at Virginia Garcia Memorial Health Center, credits his parents with instilling in him the values of social justice and Catholic social teaching. Growing up in the Washington, DC, area in the 1970s, he joined his father to raise funds for the United Farmworkers March. They had a family connection to this issue; Muñoz's grandfather, who was originally from Mexico, worked on farms in California and Montana. Muñoz ended up devoting his education and career to finding answers to the question: "What might be some positive solutions to get at the roots of inequity?" Today this inspiration manifests in the mission of the health care organization he leads, which aims to give high quality, culturally appropriate, trauma-informed wraparound care to the marginalized. Many in Virginia Garcia's patient population are uninsured farmworkers who have a nationwide life expectancy of 49. When he started at Virginia Garcia 30 years ago, they operated out of a three-car garage that had been converted into a clinic, a building that he says was "a hodgepodge of duct tape and chewing gum." The patient population was at 7,000; today it is 52,000. In 2010, they built a new flagship clinic, the Cornelius Wellness

Center, which offers health care, a dental clinic, and classes. Virginia Garcia now has 17 sites, patients that speak 60 different languages, and approximately 600 employees. They have opened five school-based health clinics, five primary care clinics, and six dental clinics. Their services have become even more important during the pandemic, a time when patients in the populations Virginia Garcia serves were getting sick more than four times the rate of the overall population. This spring, with government vaccine allocations, Virginia Garcia was hoping to vaccinate more than 30,000 patients in 12 weeks, which was so important for a population of essential workers who may not have insurance and may have financial pressures to go to work while sick. With public health wraparound services, clinicians and social workers are able to connect people not only with vaccines but to services and support such as the Oregon Worker Relief Fund. Under Muñoz's leadership the organization has definitely grown, but the mission has stayed the same and staff retention remains high. Muñoz talks about working for Virginia Garcia as a more than a job but a "vocation—living out how you want to be in the world."

The University's Mission

The University of Portland, an independently governed Catholic university guided by the Congregation of Holy Cross, addresses significant questions of human concern through disciplinary and interdisciplinary studies of the arts, sciences, and humanities and through studies in majors and professional programs at the undergraduate and graduate levels. As a diverse community of scholars dedicated to excellence and innovation, we pursue teaching and learning, faith and formation, service and leadership in the classroom, residence halls, and the world. Because we value the development of the whole person, the University honors faith and reason as ways of knowing, promotes ethical reflection, and prepares people who respond to the needs of the world and its human family.

A Brief History of the University

By the time the Reverend Alexander Christie was appointed Archbishop of Portland in 1898, the city had already emerged as a major metropolitan center in the Pacific Northwest. What was needed, Christie said, was a university.

Tradition has it that while traveling aboard ship along the Willamette River Christie noticed a large building atop Waud's Bluff. When he learned that it was West Hall (renamed Waldschmidt Hall in 1992, in honor of the late Most Rev. Paul E. Waldschmidt, C.S.C., president of the University from 1962-1978), the site of the defunct Portland University founded by the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1891, Christie decided to purchase it (with financial assistance from the Congregation of Holy Cross) for the school of his vision. He named it "Columbia University" after the mighty river that flowed nearby, and when it opened its doors on September 5, 1901, it was staffed with priests from the archdiocese.

Christie realized that his school needed more than he was able to provide through the archdiocese, so he approached the Congregation of Holy Cross's Indiana Province with a challenge: "Take over Columbia and make it the Notre Dame of the Pacific Northwest!" The challenge was accepted, and the following September the C.S.C.s, as they were called, assumed ownership. Christie's challenge had special meaning to the C.S.C.s, for in 1841 several members of their order had traveled from France to Indiana, where they founded the University of Notre Dame.

Their success assured Christie that his own vision would one day be realized.

In 1925, the College of Arts and Sciences was founded. In the 1930s, the University's name was changed to the University of Portland, the St. Vincent Hospital School of Nursing joined the University as the College of Nursing, and the School of Business was created.

In 1948, the School of Engineering was created, followed by the Graduate School in 1950 and the School of Education in 1962. In 1967 the Congregation of Holy Cross order transferred ownership of the University to a lay Board of Regents.

Today, some 4,300 students and 244 full-time faculty members are engaged in nationally honored teaching and research on the campus once on the edge of the American wilderness. The University annually garners honors as among the ten best (most recently second) in the West from *U.S. News & World Report*; has been consistently ranked as one of the top producers for Fulbright awards among U.S. colleges/universities (*Chronicle of Higher Education*), and this year was the top producer of student Fulbright awards among master's institutions in the nation; and sends graduates into the world every spring to become leaders in every field of endeavor imaginable. In many ways, 120 years after Archbishop Christie had a terrific idea on a ship in the Willamette River, his dream has come to pass.

The Coat of Arms

The historic shield of the University of Portland is a green shield bearing a silver cross moline and crossed anchors. Beneath the cross and anchors are six wavy bars of silver and blue and on a blue chief an open book with gold clasps. This is an adaptation of the arms of the Congregation of Holy Cross and the city of Portland. The motto is placed on an escroll under the shield and is *Veritas vos liberabit* ("The truth will set you free"). The supporters flanking the coat of arms are limbs of oak and laurel, symbolic of strength and success.

Chain of Office

The President's Chain of Office is the symbol of the authority of the President and of the unity a university forges from its diverse communities. There are six medallions in the chain, cast in silver, representing the major constituencies of the University: the State of Oregon, the Alumni, the Students, the Faculty, the Congregation of Holy Cross, and the Board of Regents. Tying these six medallions together is the heptagon in enameled silver displaying the symbol of the City of Roses and Mt. Hood. Rising over Mt. Hood is the Morning Star, symbolic of Mary, Mother of the Word Incarnate, patroness of the University. The heptagon is also representative of the Trivium and the Quadrivium, the curricula of the medieval university. At the bottom of the chain is the Coat of Arms of the University of Portland cast in enameled silver. The connecting links are cast in the shape of roots and branches of the rose.

The Brother Godfrey Vassallo, C.S.C., Memorial Mace

The ceremonial mace is a traditional emblem of the authority of the president and faculty at institutions of higher learning and is usually carried by the grand marshal in academic processions. At the University of Portland a mace was commissioned in honor of Brother Godfrey, who served as Grand Marshal for many years, and was used for the first time at the seventy-fifth commencement in 1977.

University of Portland's mace is made of polished myrtle wood with bronze trim. The cross at the top symbolizes the founding of the University as a Christian institution. Metal plates bear the names of all University of Portland presidents and the name of the mace.

The Christus Magister Medal

University of Portland's Christus Magister Medal is awarded annually to men and women of international distinction. Those to whom the award is presented have evinced a vigorous spiritual life and an accomplished professional career that has significantly advanced knowledge, been of inimitable service to his or her fellow men and women, and been an inspiration and consolation to the world. The Christus Magister Medal is the University's highest honor, conferred upon those men and women whose lives have illustrated and enhanced the University's mission, now more than a century old.

Academic Dress and Procession

The history of academic dress dates back to the Middle Ages when many of the scholars were also clerics and wore the costume of the monastic orders. In 1321, the University of Cambridge adopted specific styles and color combinations for its faculties. American colleges and universities desired to adopt a standard code of academic dress, and at a conference held at Columbia University in 1895, representatives from various institutions adopted a code and regulations governing academic dress for colleges and universities in the United States. The standards continue to be followed by the American Council on Education.

The costumes worn today are all traditional and their colors, trimmings, and patterns interpret the degree, the field of learning, and the institution that conferred the degree. The bachelor's gown has long pointed sleeves and is designed to be worn closed; the master's gown has an oblong sleeve open at the wrist. The rear part of its oblong shape is square cut and the front part has an arc cut away. The doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves, is faced with velvet and has three bars across the sleeves. The color of the velvet is distinctive of the degree.

The hood tells the story. The type of degree (bachelor's, master's, doctor's) is indicated by the width of the velvet edging and the length of the hood, the

doctor's hood being the longest and of fuller shape than the others. The color of the velvet edging denotes the field of learning and the colors of the lining denote the school which conferred the degree. The color of the tassel, worn on the left side of the mortarboard, also indicates the field of study and is gold for those with doctor's degrees. The colors you will see today in the hoods and gowns of our faculty represent the various fields of learning:

white, Arts, Letters and Humanities;
drab, Business;
light blue, Education;
orange, Engineering;
brown, Fine Arts;
purple, Law;
lemon yellow, Library Science;
pink, Music;
apricot, Nursing;
dark blue, Philosophy;
golden yellow, Science;
scarlet, Theology.

The academic procession is led by the Grand Marshal, a faculty member appointed by the President. A traditional order of procession is followed: First come the candidates for degrees according to the order in which the degrees are to be conferred; next, members of the faculty led by the Faculty Marshal; and finally the honorary degree recipients and other members of the platform party, followed by the President of the University. The order is reversed for the recessional.
