COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Ari Shapiro Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa Washington, D.C.

When journalists-in-training ask Ari Shapiro—co-host of NPR's daily news program All Things *Considered*—to name the most important trait for a successful career in the field, his answer is invariably "curiosity." This quality has always helped him stay attentive, follow a story, ask a question, and try to understand a different point of view. In his present work as well as his many previous roles with NPR-as White House Correspondent, Justice Correspondent, and the London-based International Correspondent—his reporting has taken him all over the world to speak directly to those in power and those without. He has covered wars in Iraq, Israel, and Ukraine and the devastating aftermath of the Pulse nightclub mass shooting in Florida. "Friends ask me all the time how I stay optimistic in the face of the hard stories I hear," he says. "I often talk to people on the worst day of their lives, a school shooting, a refugee crisis. The more I meet people I think, How could I allow myself to slip into despair when people are fighting so hard? It would be an insult to them if I were to allow myself to sink into pessimism." In his new memoir, The Best Strangers

in the World: Stories from a Life Spent Listening, published this spring, he shares stories of many people who have exhibited a kind of defiant joy in the face of hardship: a Zimbabwean activist who organized a community flower-planting event to celebrate renewed citizen agency after the end of a dictatorship, a man who pursued a career in interior design after experiencing a period of houselessness. One path to joy for Shapiro himself is music and live performance. He has been a singer for Pink Martini since 2009. He also performs Och & Oy, a cabaret show with Tony Award winner Alan Cumming. He is everinterested in the connections that grow out of stories and music—whether that's through an intimate radio conversation on air or through a song he learns to perform in Arabic with a Jordanian-Palestinian collaborator, who makes a point to introduce Ari Shapiro as his Jewish friend during performances in the Middle East. Shapiro grew up in the Portland area, and his mother is a former communication studies professor here at University of Portland. He now lives in Washington, DC, with his husband, Mike Gottlieb.

CHRISTUS MAGISTER MEDAL

Abbot Jeremy Driscoll, O.S.B. Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa Mount Angel, Oregon

If you look at the map of Mount Angel Abbey, you'll find a beautiful, peaceful campus with a Romanesque-style church, a thriving retreat center, a vibrant seminary, an award-winning theological library, a coffee shop, and a monastic brewery. But there's another Mount Angel map—one with roots in a 1500-year-old Benedictine tradition that guides the hours and days and routines of the 50 monks who call Mount Angel home. This "other" map is one of interiority—it's full of mystery and silence and prayer. And this has been Abbot Jeremy Driscoll's home for the past 50 years. Originally from Idaho, Abbot Jeremy came to Mount Angel for seminary school and at age 22 decided it was the place where he would devote his life to God as a monk. In 1973, he became a Benedictine monk, and he was ordained a priest at Mount Angel in 1981. Abbot Jeremy was sent to Rome to study patristics and Church fathers at the Augustinianum Patristic Institute and earned a doctoral

degree at the Pontificio Ateneo Sant' Anselmo. For about 20 years he was assigned to teach half the year in Rome and half the year teaching in the seminary at Mount Angel. He has written many books, some that involve his scholarly work on the church fathers, and some that are written with a wider audience in mind, such as A Monk's Alphabet: Moments of Stillness in a Turning World, What Happens at Mass, and Awesome Glory: Resurrection in Scripture, Liturgy, and Theology. In 2005 he was appointed by Pope John Paul II as consultor to the Congregation for Divine Worship, an appointment that was renewed under Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis. In 2016, he was elected the 12th abbot of his community. He continues to teach on the liturgy and eucharist and ways to find God in all things. "If you can still your spirit enough," he says, "everyone you meet is God's way of speaking to you. A blade of grass, a shard of light. It's beautiful. Everything is beautiful if you recognize it as a gift."

Kupiri Ackerman-Barger, Ph.D., R.N. Doctor of Public Service, Honoris Causa Sacramento, California

Kupiri Ackerman-Barger, PhD, RN, CNE, ANEF, FAAN, is associate dean for Health Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion and a clinical professor at the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing at UC Davis. She is also the director of Faculty Development for Education and Teaching for UC Davis Health. Her ongoing interdisciplinary work has been recognized through fellowships in the American Academy of Nurses, the 2019 UC Davis Charles P. Nash Award, and many more. And her scholarship has appeared in publications including Journal of Nursing Education, Nursing Education Perspectives, and Journal of the National Black Nurses Association. Ackerman-Barger's interest in health equity and social justice dates back to her time in nursing school, when she learned about the correspondence between certain diseases and certain races and ethnicities. Why was that? Her gut feeling was that there was more to the story than the accepted answer of "genetic predisposition." There had to be a sociopolitical cause, too. She has devoted her remarkable career to looking for a more complete answer. And her extensive research has affirmed her intuition. Her work brings a patient's allostatic load—that is, the cumulative burden of chronic stress and life events-into the conversation. "Let's be clear."

she says. "When we're talking about differences in health outcomes, we're talking about health disparities." Ackerman-Barger has committed herself to resolving these pernicious disparities. She has combined her expertise in nursing and education to advance inclusive learning environments and to advance health equity. Her extensive research has shown that patients typically feel more comfortable working with healthcare providers from a similar background and that we need more people from diverse communities making decisions on what should be studied and how it should be studied. As a national consultant and speaker, she advocates tirelessly for underserved and underrepresented groups in health professions. "Success looks like organizations institutionalizing their change," she says. This includes two key documents. The first is to have a strategic plan that specifically addresses DEIJ work. The second is to have an action plan in place. "You need to articulate both the what and the how." She has been heartened by what she's seen in the years since the pandemic started. "It was getting to where I didn't think I'd see change in my lifetime," she says. "But I've seen change. It gives me hope."

Senator Patrick Leahy Doctor of Public Service, Honoris Causa Montpelier, Vermont

Patrick Leahy served as a United States senator from Vermont from 1975 to 2023. At the time of his retirement, his forty-eight year career made him the thirdlongest serving senator in the country's history. From 2012 to 2015 and from 2021 to 2023, he was president pro tempore, making him third in line to the most powerful position in the world. A member of the Democratic Party, he chaired the Senate Appropriations Committee, the Senate Judiciary Committee, and the Senate Agriculture Committee at various points during his tenure. Leahy is humbled by his long and storied career. "I've had this sense of awe about the Senate from an early age," he said, in a retirement speech on the Senate floor, and went on to describe visiting the chamber during his days at Georgetown law school and watching transfixed as members debated the most pressing issues of the day. Never in his wildest dreams did he imagine having his name etched into one of the desks in the chamber, let alone casting 17,000 votes and serving alongside 400 different senators. And he did his best to work with as many of those senators as he could.

Throughout his career he was a champion of bipartisanship, with more than half of the bills he sponsored gaining support from both Democrats and Republicans. Looking back, he has much to be proud of, including expanding the Violence Against Women Act, shoring up the Freedom of Information Act, advocating for DNA evidence to be used in criminal justice cases, cleaning up parts of Vietnam marred by the war there, and working to rehabilitate the nation's relationship with Cuba. A lifelong fan of comics, Leahy has appeared in five different Batman movies. (Among all senators it's a tie for the next closest, with zero.) For Leahy, the Senate, at its best, serves as the collective conscience of the country, and he laments the loss in recent years of certain norms and practices. "Everywhere is somewhere," he said, emphasizing the importance of understanding the country as a whole. He embodies grace and statesmanship of a sort that anyone can appreciate, and he has been a beacon for tolerance and understanding no matter our differences.

Michael Nelson Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa Portland, Oregon

For Mike Nelson '76, hard work has always been a family affair. In 1945, his late father co-founded a janitorial supplies company here in Portland while he was on leave from the Navy. As soon as Mike was old enough to have a license, he was hopping in the truck to make deliveries to Walter E. Nelson Co.'s longtime customers. Now Mike is the company's CEO. University of Portland, as it turns out, was one of the company's first customers. Mike continued his apprenticeship while he was a student at UP. Once classes were over, Mike was on the clock, a time he calls "a 90-hour workweek situation." And being his father's son, he loved it. During these years, Mike's role in the business began to evolve. As an accounting major at UP, he was learning things that he could directly apply to the business. He started paying bills, doing accounting work before returning to his dorm room in Shipstad to hang out with his buddies in Alpha Kappa Psi—many of whom are still tight today—and finish his homework. Mike started to see how the business could grow. He encouraged his dad to buy property and to incorporate the business. "My professors were almost consultants," Mike says. "What I learned I

immediately put into practice." And the business grew. Today, the Walter E. Nelson Company has about 1,800 employees, with 18 locations in the Pacific Northwest. What has stayed the same were many of the long-time customers and relationships, UP among them. Mike has honored his relationship with UP not only through his leadership on the Board of Regents but also through his generosity. He is responsible for funding the new state-of-the-art space for University of Portland's Facilities Services team. Mike and his wife, Arlette, are the proud parents of four children, one of whom graduated from UP's School of Nursing & Health Innovations. In 2013, the Nelsons established the Walter E. Nelson Distinguished Professorship in the Pamplin School of Business. They have also generously supported academics and scholarships and established the School of Nursing Nelson Family Simulated Ambulatory Care Center. The value of hard work is still central to who he is. Mike will tell you that his grandmother was a chambermaid, and his grandfather was a longshoreman. He has never lost sight of his roots, the importance of humility, or the vision his father had for the business.

Moe O'Connor Doctor of Public Service, Honoris Causa Lake Oswego, Oregon

The University of Portland sports landscape looked very different in 1979-five years before the Chiles Center dome first sprang to life—when Moe O'Connor arrived on The Bluff and boldly accepted a daunting mission: to build an intercollegiate women's athletic program from the ground up. As UP's first women's athletic director, hired to comply with Title IX's equal opportunity decree, O'Connor had three months in the summer of '79 to hire part-time coaches, assemble seven teams with non-scholarship athletes, buy uniforms, and cold-call opponents to schedule games. "Everything happened very quickly," O'Connor recalls. "I'm not quite sure how I did it—I just jumped in." Only 27 years old at the time and new to Portland from Illinois, O'Connor formed immediate bonds with coaches in the men's program. "I didn't hide in my office. I had to get out there," she says. "We had no support staff or counselors to check on student-athletes' grades. It was all me. I got to know our athletes very well, which was great." In addition to athletic director duties, O'Connor served as women's head volleyball and tennis coach and rally squad advisor. Before the end of her seven-year run, the University opened the Chiles Center and

made the monumental move to NCAA Division I. She helped lay the early foundation for many victory celebrations that would follow, including two women's soccer national championships in the early 2000s. O'Connor went on to serve for 30 years at Portland Community College—13 years on the physical education faculty and 17 years as the department's faculty chair. She also had a brief stint as an interim dean. Looking back on her five decades of teaching and sports administration, O'Connor is proud to have played a part in the steady growth and the indelible impact of women's collegiate sports. "From the start, I always believed women should be competing at the same level as the men," she says. Her love of the game continues today as she cheers on her grandchildren in various fields of play. And when the University recently honored her in conjunction with Title IX's 50th anniversary, O'Connor felt a renewed rush of purple pride revisiting a women's sports enterprise that has thrived over 44 years of steadfast competition-empowering countless women to become leaders, achievers, and lifelong winners. "I'm amazed, humbled, and filled with so many great memories of my years as a Pilot. It was a very special time."

Steve Moore, Ph.D. Doctor of Public Service, Honoris Causa Portland, Oregon

Steve Moore, Ph.D. had banked a quarter-century of rewarding experiences as an educator and senior college administrator when, in 2006, the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust sought his unique blend of leadership, vision, collaboration and team building for its chief executive officer role. The Vancouver, Washington-based trust welcomed his creativity in not only its grantmaking, but also in developing stellar enrichment programming for Northwest nonprofits and a deep commitment "to see the fruits of our work grow on other people's trees." Moore recognized the work of the Trust sublimely intersected with four prominent streams of his life and career: to help leaders be their best, to bring forth great ideas to help the world flourish, to help young adults achieve the fullness of their lives, and to enhance the human experience through spiritual, intellectual, and relational formation. Recently retired after more than 16 years of impactful servant leadership as Murdock Trust CEO, Moore is gratified to see a familiar thread connecting his charitable work to his many decades of love, appreciation and devotion to higher education. Hailing from Texas, he discovered faith in college. After doing graduate work at St. Andrew's University in Scotland, he earned a Master of Divinity at Asbury Theological Seminary and a Doctor of

Philosophy from University of Michigan. He taught world religions and ethics while also serving as Vice President for Campus Life at Baylor University and Seattle Pacific University, and Senior Vice President at Asbury Theological Seminary. The journey taught him that institutions like University of Portland offer students a thoughtful, mission-oriented college experience rooted in a committed community. "It's about the formation of people to live effective and purposeful lives that help them to give from their deepest strengths," he says. "Faculty and staff become bridges over which truth and learning engages the lives of students. The ripple from that goes into the lives of families, the workplace, their communities and beyond." Moore's personal bridges of truth and love connect to his wife Thanne, their adult children and their spouses Madison and Chandi, Maegan and Jon, and Mollie. With five books and more than 40 articles under his authorship, Moore's pearls of wisdom for college graduates include actively seeking out opportunities to learn and grow, and making time for service, international travel and, "to love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strengthand love your neighbor as yourself," he says. "And learn to ask good questions. That will serve you throughout your life."

The University's History

A Brief History of the University

Tradition has it that when Reverend Alexander Christie was appointed Archbishop of Portland in 1898, he had a vision for a university. While traveling aboard a ship along the Willamette River, Christie noticed a large brick building atop Waud's Bluff. When he learned that it was the site of the defunct Portland University founded by the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1891, Christie decided to purchase it (with financial assistance from the Congregation of Holy Cross) for the school of his vision. He named it "Columbia University" after the mighty river, and when it opened its doors on September 5, 1901, it was staffed with priests from the archdiocese. Christie realized that his school needed more support, so he approached the Congregation of Holy Cross's Indiana Province, and the following September they assumed ownership. Christie's vision had special meaning to the C.S.C.s. In 1841 several members of their order traveled from France to Indiana, where they founded the University of Notre Dame. Their success assured Christie that his own vision would one day be realized. In 1925, the College of Arts and Sciences was founded. In the 1930s, the University's name was changed to the University of Portland, the St. Vincent Hospital School of Nursing joined the University as the College of Nursing, and the

School of Business was created. In 1948, the School of Engineering was created, followed by the Graduate School in 1950 and the School of Education in 1962. In 1967 the Congregation of Holy Cross order transferred ownership of the University to a lay Board of Regents.

Today, UP is Oregon's largest private and the state's only Catholic university. It also is Oregon's only comprehensive university with schools of business, education, engineering, nursing, a College of Arts and Sciences, and a graduate school. There are more than 40 undergraduate programs and 30 minors, as well as 18 graduate programs, and more than 1,300 courses. For 28 consecutive years, the University has earned a top-10 ranking by US News & World Report in the "Regional Universities - West" classification, including the number 1 spot in the 2022 rankings. For nine consecutive years, UP has been the top Oregon school in Kiplinger's Personal *Finance* annual ranking of best values in private universities. And for three consecutive years, Bloomberg Businessweek has named University of Portland the top school in Oregon for "return on investment" in a state-by-state ranking of schools providing graduates with the most return for the price of their education.

The University's Mission and Alumni

The University's Mission

The University of Portland, an independently governed Catholic university guided by the Congregation of Holy Cross, addresses significant questions of human concern through studies of the arts, sciences, and humanities. As a diverse community of scholars dedicated to excellence and innovation, we pursue teaching and learning, faith and formation, service and leadership in the classroom, residence halls, and the world. Because we value the development of the whole person, the University honors faith and reason as ways of knowing, promotes ethical reflection, and prepares people who respond to the needs of the world and its human family.

The University's Alumni

Coat of Arms/Chain of Office/Memorial Mace/ Christus Magister Medal

The Coat of Arms

The historic green shield of the University of Portland bears a silver cross moline and crossed anchors. Beneath the cross and anchors are six wavy bars of silver and blue, and an open book with gold clasps. This is an adaptation of the arms of the Congregation of Holy Cross and the city of Portland. The motto, Veritas vos liberabit ("The truth will set you free") is on an escroll under the shield. Flanking the coat of arms are oak and laurel, symbols of strength and success.

Chain of Office

The President's Chain of Office is the symbol of unity the university forges from its diverse communities. Six medallions represent the major constituencies of the University: the State of Oregon, the Alumni, the Students, the Faculty, the Congregation of Holy Cross, and the Board of Regents. Tying them together is the heptagon displaying the symbol of the City of Roses and Mt. Hood. Rising over Mt. Hood is the Morning Star, symbolic of Mary, Mother of the Word Incarnate, patroness of the University. The heptagon is also representative of the Trivium and the Quadrivium, the curricula of the medieval university. At the bottom of the chain is the Coat of Arms of the University of Portland. The connecting links are cast in the shape of roots and branches of the rose.

The Brother Godfrey Vassallo, C.S.C., Memorial Mace

The ceremonial mace is a traditional emblem at institutions of higher learning in academic processions. At the University of Portland, a mace made of polished myrtle wood with bronze trim was commissioned in honor of Brother Godfrey. who served as Grand Marshal for many years. It was used for the first time at the 75th commencement in 1977. The cross at the top symbolizes the founding of the University as a Christian institution. Metal plates bear the names of all University of Portland presidents and the name of the mace.

The Christus Magister Medal

The Christus Magister Medal is awarded annually to men and women of international distinction. Recipients have evinced a vigorous spiritual life and an accomplished career that has significantly advanced knowledge, been of inimitable service to humanity, and been an inspiration and consolation to the world. It is the University's highest honor, conferred upon those whose lives have illustrated and enhanced the University's mission.

Academic Dress and Procession

The history of academic dress dates back to the Middle Ages when many of the scholars were also clerics and wore the costume of the monastic orders. In 1321, the University of Cambridge adopted specific styles and color combinations for its faculties. American colleges and universities desired to adopt a standard code of academic dress, and at a conference held at Columbia University in 1895, representatives from various institutions adopted a code and regulations governing academic dress for colleges and universities in the United States. The standards continue to be followed by the American Council on Education.

The costumes worn today are all traditional and their colors, trimmings, and patterns interpret the degree, the field of learning, and the institution that conferred the degree. The type of degree (bachelor's, master's, doctor's) is indicated by the width of the velvet edging and the length of the hood, the doctor's hood being the longest and of fuller shape than the others. The color of the velvet edging denotes the field of learning and the colors of the lining denote the school which conferred the degree.

The color of the tassel, worn on the left side of the mortarboard, also indicates the field of study and is gold for those with doctor's degrees. The colors you will see today in the hoods and gowns of our faculty represent the various fields of learning:

white, Arts, Letters and Humanities; drab, Business; light blue, Education; orange, Engineering; brown, Fine Arts; purple, Law; lemon yellow, Library Science; pink, Music; apricot, Nursing; dark blue, Philosophy; golden yellow, Science; scarlet, Theology.

The academic procession is led by the Grand Marshal, a faculty member appointed by the President. A traditional order of procession is followed: First come the candidates for degrees according to the order in which the degrees are to be conferred; next, members of the faculty led by the Faculty Marshal; and finally the honorary degree recipients and other members of the platform party, followed by the President of the University. The order is reversed for the recessional.
