COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Michael Eric Dyson, PhD
Nashville, Tennessee

Michael Eric Dyson is an academic, public scholar, author, Baptist minister, radio host, and seasoned political analyst. A distinguished public speaker and preacher, he is as versed in Bible readings as in hip hop lyrics, and he often interlaces the two. He speaks regularly on the subjects of politics, pop culture, religion, and racial justice. At Vanderbilt University he holds the Centennial Chair and serves as University Distinguished Professor of African American and Diaspora Studies in the College of Arts and Science and University Distinguished Professor of Ethics and Society in the Divinity School. He has also taught at many other prestigious American universities, including Princeton, Brown, Middlebury, Columbia, University of Pennsylvania, and Georgetown. As he says, "Teaching and preaching are at the foundation of everything I do." Born and raised in Detroit, MI, Dyson became a preacher at age 21, and later earned a bachelor's in philosophy from Carson-Newman College, where he worked as a cleaner at a machine shop to pay his tuition. He also served as a pastor during his undergraduate years. From there he went on to earn a PhD in religion from Princeton University. His subject is race, class, culture, and religion in America, and he believes that a

frank examination of the truth of America's past and present is the way toward a better future. Paraphrasing an idea from Howard Thurman's *Jesus and the Disinherited*, a book that Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., carried with him, Dyson says it's important not to be a "prisoner of the event," or present moment that one is facing. "We have to use our imagination," Dyson says, "to borrow from the future." He has written more than 25 books, and has won the Langston Hughes Medal, an American Book Award, Southern Book Award, and two NAACP Image Awards. In *Tears We Cannot Stop: A Sermon to White America*, he wrote, "[A]ll of us, from agreeable agnostics to fire-and-brimstone Protestants, from devout Catholics to observant Jews, from devoted Muslims to those who claim no god at all, share a language of moral repair. That language is our common meeting ground, our tool of analysis, and yes, our inspiration for repentance, our hope for redemption." He has also written biographies on Malcom X, Martin Luther King, Jr., Barack Obama, and Tupac Shakur, among many other figures. His most recent book *Represent: The Unfinished Fight for the Vote*, was written in collaboration with Marc Favreau. Dyson is married to writer and ordained minister Marcia L. Dyson and has three children and three grandchildren.

CHRISTUS MAGISTER MEDAL

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., DPhil
Notre Dame, Indiana

After 19 years serving as president of the University of Notre Dame, Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C looks back on a two-decade presidential tenure from 2005–2024 as “both a great privilege and a heavy responsibility.” He is proud that in this demanding era of higher education—when a president is expected to meet competing, and often incompatible, demands—he guided Notre Dame to notable advancements in research and academic achievement, “without compromising on our commitment to excellent undergraduate education and to a Catholic mission that informs all we do.” A philosopher trained in theology and a faculty member of Notre Dame’s Department of Philosophy since 1990, Father Jenkins earned undergraduate and advanced degrees from Notre Dame, a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Oxford, and a Master of Divinity and licentiate in sacred theology from the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley. He authored the book, *Knowledge and Faith in Thomas Aquinas*, and taught a range of courses in philosophy. At his 2005 inauguration as Notre Dame’s 17th president, Fr. Jenkins vowed to make the

university “a healing, unifying, enlightening force for a world deeply in need,” adding, “Let no one ever say we dreamed too small.” He has transitioned to President Emeritus of Notre Dame and is currently enjoying a sabbatical year. In the fall of 2025, he will return to teaching and scholarship at Notre Dame and to continuing ministry as a priest. He is honored to accept the University of Portland’s highest honor, the *Christus Magister* Medal. He urges 2025 graduates from Portland and Notre Dame—sister Holy Cross universities—to “be realistic about the world you enter but be confident in yourselves.” “Make real friends and build real communities,” Father Jenkins says. “Contribute to what Pope Francis has called a ‘culture of encounter’—one in which you not only notice but look at people; you not only hear but listen; you not only pass by but stop and try to understand them.” “If you have the gift of faith, cultivate it through prayer, reflection, and participation in faith communities. Your faith will give you light and strength throughout your life.” “Look for joy,” he concludes, “and not just ease, comfort, and acclaim.”

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

Anthea Butler, PhD
Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Dr. Anthea Butler has devoted her career to studying relationship between religion and culture. As the Geraldine R. Segal Professor in American Social Thought at the University of Pennsylvania and recipient of the prestigious Martin Marty Award from the American Academy of religion, she brings both scholarly depth and personal insight to all of her work. Her recent book, *White Evangelical Racism: The Politics of Morality in America*, invites readers into a nuanced exploration of how religious identity and racial history have shaped each other. “I think we have to go back to what is the foundation,” Butler has said. By exploring historical shifts in society, she is able to find connections and patterns that have otherwise gone unnoticed. And this can lead to startling discoveries. In her work, Butler distinguishes between theological traditions and cultural expressions of faith. For her, evangelicalism has undergone a kind of evolution, taking on a new “cultural and political definition.” As a student of religious and cultural history, she finds this shift fascinating. As faith communities have become aligned along more overtly political lines, they have produced religious leaders who are operate as celebrities and have to navigate the challenges of a very public life. She points to Billy Graham’s relationship

with President Eisenhower as a pivotal moment when religious leadership began to take on this more political aspect. What makes Butler’s perspective distinctive is her attention and commitment to diversity within religious traditions. For her, it’s a mistake to talk about *the* evangelical movement. There are “evangelicals plural”—white, Black, Latino, Asian-American, and more. Understanding the difference between how these communities engage with their faith is essential for understanding American religious life. She urges us to widen the aperture and to examine what she calls “parachurch movements.” These are religious gatherings outside traditional church structures that offer community and purpose. “It gives you the sense of community, but also gives you the sense that you, too, as an individual, have the power to change something,” she says, highlighting how these spaces fulfill a person’s need for belonging and meaning. Through all of her work, Butler invites us to consider how our faith shapes our identity and how religious communities live on the porous border between private and public life. This creates a powerful, potent tension at the heart of life in America. And she shows us that in order to understand the present, we have to pay deep attention to the past.

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

K. Joanne Pike '96, DrPH

Austin, Texas

Joanne Pike '96, DrPH is president and CEO of the Alzheimer's Association, the global leader in Alzheimer's and dementia care, support, and research. She is also CEO of the Alzheimer's Impact Movement and chair of the World Dementia Council. Dr. Pike has dedicated her career to serving communities in pursuit of improved quality of life for people and families. After earning her B.A. in psychology from UP, she worked as a therapist for several years. Inspired by the impact her work had, she sought to grow her capacity to improve health outcomes at scale by transitioning to a role with the American Cancer Society, a leading cancer-fighting nonprofit organization. While at the American Cancer Society, she recognized the power of public health to meaningfully improve health and quality of life at the population level. During this time, she earned a doctorate in public health from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, which enabled her to increase her impact on people and communities. She then moved to a leadership role with the Preventive Health Partnership, a collaboration among leading health nonprofits aimed at preventing cancer, diabetes, heart disease, and stroke. In 2016, Dr. Pike joined the Alzheimer's Association. Her work with the organization is

guided by her public health expertise, her belief in the power of dedicated voluntary health organizations, and by a personal connection to dementia. Her grandmother lived with dementia, and Dr. Pike witnessed the challenges her own mother faced in caring for a loved one with the disease. These experiences, and the experiences of the nearly 7 million people living with Alzheimer's and their care partners and families, guide Dr. Pike as she leads the Alzheimer's Association at a critical time. Recent advances, including multiple newly-approved disease-modifying treatments, have ushered in a new era of treatment, care, and brain health. Amid these advances, Dr. Pike is leading the Association's strategy to dramatically transform the Alzheimer's and dementia landscape over the next decade, while continuing to meet the urgency of today for people, families, and communities. She is relentlessly hopeful about the future of Alzheimer's and dementia. "I believe we can achieve a future in which people across all communities routinely take action to promote brain health, reduce their risk, and prevent dementia; screening, diagnosis, quality care, and effective treatments are accessible to everyone; and clinical symptoms can be slowed, stopped, and even prevented," she says.

The University's History

A Brief History of the University

Tradition has it that when Reverend Alexander Christie was appointed Archbishop of Portland in 1898, he had a vision for a university. While traveling aboard a ship along the Willamette River, Christie noticed a large brick building atop Waud's Bluff. When he learned that it was the site of the defunct Portland University founded by the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1891, Christie decided to purchase it (with financial assistance from the Congregation of Holy Cross) for the school of his vision. He named it "Columbia University" after the mighty river, and when it opened its doors on September 5, 1901, it was staffed with priests from the archdiocese. Christie realized that his school needed more support, so he approached the Congregation of Holy Cross's Indiana Province, and the following September they assumed ownership. Christie's vision had special meaning to the C.S.C.s. In 1841 several members of their order traveled from France to Indiana, where they founded the University of Notre Dame. Their success assured Christie that his own vision would one day be realized. In 1925, the College of Arts and Sciences was founded. In the 1930s, the University's name was changed

to the University of Portland, the St. Vincent Hospital School of Nursing joined the University as the College of Nursing, and the School of Business was created. In 1948, the School of Engineering was created, followed by the Graduate School in 1950 and the School of Education in 1962. In 1967 the Congregation of Holy Cross order transferred ownership of the University to a lay Board of Regents.

Today, UP stands alone as Oregon's only Catholic university and only comprehensive institution with schools of business, education, engineering, nursing, a College of Arts and Sciences, and a graduate school. There are more than 40 undergraduate programs and 30 minors, as well as 18 graduate programs, and more than 1,300 courses. For 30 consecutive years, the University has earned a top-10 ranking by *US News & World Report* in the "Regional Universities – West" classification. The *Wall Street Journal* ranked UP #1 among all colleges and universities in the Pacific Northwest in its 2025 Best Colleges in the U.S. Rankings. Additionally, UP earned 4.5 out of 5 stars in *Money Magazine's* 2024 listing of The Best Colleges in America.

The University's Mission and Alumni

The University's Mission

The University of Portland, an independently governed Catholic university guided by the Congregation of Holy Cross, addresses significant questions of human concern through studies of the arts, sciences, and humanities. As a diverse community of scholars dedicated to excellence and innovation, we pursue teaching and learning, faith and formation, service and leadership in the classroom, residence halls, and the world. Because we value the development of the whole person, the University honors faith and reason as ways of knowing, promotes ethical reflection, and prepares people who respond to the needs of the world and its human family.

The Coat of Arms

The historic green shield of the University of Portland bears a silver cross moline and crossed anchors. Beneath the cross and anchors are six wavy bars of silver and blue, and an open book with gold clasps. This is an adaptation of the arms of the Congregation of Holy Cross and the city of Portland. The motto, *Veritas vos liberabit* ("The truth will set you free") is on an escroll under the shield. Flanking the coat of arms are oak and laurel, symbols of strength and success.

Chain of Office

The President's Chain of Office is the symbol of unity the university forges from its diverse communities. Six medallions represent the major constituencies of the University: the State of Oregon, the Alumni, the Students, the Faculty, the Congregation of Holy Cross, and the Board of Regents. Tying them together is the heptagon displaying the symbol of the City of Roses and Mt. Hood. Rising over Mt. Hood is the Morning Star, symbolic of Mary, Mother of the Word Incarnate, patroness of the University. The heptagon is also representative of the Trivium and the Quadrivium, the curricula of the medieval university. At the bottom of the chain is the Coat of Arms of the University of Portland. The connecting links are cast in the shape of roots and branches of the rose.

The Brother Godfrey Vassallo, C.S.C., Memorial Mace

The ceremonial mace is a traditional emblem at institutions of higher learning in academic processions. At the University of Portland, a mace made of polished myrtle wood with bronze trim was commissioned in honor of Brother Godfrey, who served as Grand Marshal for many years. It was used for the first time at the 75th commencement in 1977. The cross at the top symbolizes the founding of the University as a Christian institution. Metal plates bear the names of all University of Portland presidents and the name of the mace.

The Christus Magister Medal

The Christus Magister Medal is awarded annually to men and women of international distinction. Recipients have evinced a vigorous spiritual life and an accomplished career that has significantly advanced knowledge, been of inimitable service to humanity, and been an inspiration and consolation to the world. It is the University's highest honor, conferred upon those whose lives have illustrated and enhanced the University's mission.

Academic Dress and Procession

The history of academic dress dates back to the Middle Ages when many of the scholars were also clerics and wore the costume of the monastic orders. In 1321, the University of Cambridge adopted specific styles and color combinations for its faculties.

American colleges and universities desired to adopt a standard code of academic dress, and at a conference held at Columbia University in 1895, representatives from various institutions adopted a code and regulations governing academic dress for colleges and universities in the United States. The standards continue to be followed by the American Council on Education.

The costumes worn today are all traditional and their colors, trimmings, and patterns interpret the degree, the field of learning, and the institution that conferred the degree. The type of degree (bachelor's, master's, doctor's) is indicated by the width of the velvet edging and the length of the hood, the doctor's hood being the longest and of fuller shape than the others. The color of the velvet edging denotes the field of learning and the colors of the lining denote the school which conferred the degree.

The color of the tassel, worn on the left side of the mortarboard, also indicates the field of study and is gold for those with doctor's degrees. The colors you will see today in the hoods and gowns of our faculty represent the various fields of learning:

white, Arts, Letters and Humanities;
drab, Business;
light blue, Education;
orange, Engineering;
brown, Fine Arts;
purple, Law;
lemon yellow, Library Science;
pink, Music;
apricot, Nursing;
dark blue, Philosophy;
golden yellow, Science;
scarlet, Theology.

The academic procession is led by the Marshals, faculty members appointed by the Provost. A traditional order of procession is followed: First come the candidates for degrees according to the order in which the degrees are to be conferred, then members of the faculty, and finally, the honorary degree recipients and the members of the platform party, followed by the President and Chair of the Board of Regents of the University. The order is reversed for the recessional.
