COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Kerry Alys Robinson
Doctor of Public Service, Honoris Causa
New Haven, Connecticut

Devout Catholic, servant leader, empowering influence, imaginative author, collaborative presence, loving wife and mother. The time will come when Kerry Alys Robinson will pause long enough to appreciate the ways she has met the moments of her highly-engaged life—but critical needs in today’s world demand her to be forward-thinking and proactive. Approaching the one-year mark serving as president and CEO of Catholic Charities USA (CCUSA), Robinson revels in her organization’s humanitarian mission to “provide services to people in need, to advocate for justice in social structures, and to call the entire Church and other people of good will to do the same.” Now at the helm of the national membership organization that represents the 168 Catholic Charities agencies who provide comfort, hope, and relief to the most vulnerable around the United States, Robinson has devoted her entire professional career to strengthening and serving the Catholic Church. In 2005, Robinson became the founding director of Leadership Roundtable—dedicated to promoting excellence and best practices in management, finances, and human resource development for the Church. Upon her CCUSA appointment, Robinson transitioned to the Leadership Roundtable Board of Trustees. She previously has

served as executive director of the Opus Prize Foundation and as director of development for Saint Thomas More Catholic Chapel and Center at Yale University. In 2014, Robinson authored the prize-winning book, *Imagining Abundance: Fundraising, Philanthropy, and A Spiritual Call to Service*. The motivations behind Robinson’s work run deep, but a few lines from one of her columns in *Chicago Catholic* provide context: “If there is anything sacrosanct and urgent about what it means to be Catholic in the world today it is that we are all—every single living person on the planet—made in the image and likeness of God,” Robinson wrote. “Treating everyone, without exception, with a little awe, respect and even reverence might be just what the Church and world need.” A relentless optimist, Robinson believes the key to a joy-filled, fulfilling life is to make a meaningful difference in the lives of others. “Generosity is humankind’s birthright. We are all called to be generous and to be catalysts to inspire generosity in others,” Robinson said. “When you cultivate the discipline of being other-centered, you begin to take genuine delight in the good fortune of others. And when you take genuine delight in the good fortune of others, you will never be without a reason to celebrate.”

CHRISTUS MAGISTER MEDAL

Sister Donna Markham, O.P., Ph.D.
Chicago, Illinois

Sister Donna Markham, O.P., Ph.D., stood her ground as a compassionate, relentless champion of the most vulnerable in our society long before she became the first woman to lead Catholic Charities USA (CCUSA) in 2015. She followed her heart—and the leader within—to faithfully serve alongside her Adrian Dominican Sisters many decades before accepting the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR) “Outstanding Leadership Award” shortly after her retirement in the summer of 2023. At the ceremony, words of gratitude from President Joe Biden celebrated Sister Donna’s “trailblazing leadership,” but she was quick to share the spotlight as she reflected on a collaborative life of ministry and service: “I’ve walked among giants.” A board-certified clinical psychologist, Sister Donna devoted her career to reducing poverty, caring for at-risk populations, and transforming behavioral health. Among her many leadership roles, she served as president of the Behavioral Health Institute of Mercy Health in Cincinnati, as president and CEO for Southdown Institute in Ontario, Canada, and as prioress of the Adrian Dominican Congregation. She served on the Catholic Charities USA Board of Trustees for eight years, including two years as board chair. From 2015 to 2023, Sister Donna led CCUSA’s day-to-day operations as president and CEO.

She guided the organization’s pandemic response—providing emergency aid to its national network of Catholic agencies on the front lines while assisting in the reduction of food insecurity, evictions, and unemployment. Accepting her LCWR leadership award, Sister Donna said, “Serving in faith-driven leadership—especially in times of multiple and escalating crises—changes us. We’re never the same again. Fear diminishes. We become emboldened to take norm-shattering risks in radical service to the mission.” Prior to her retirement, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services recognized Sister Donna as one of the 15 American women of faith who have made significant contributions to the betterment of humanity. From 2016 through 2022, she made *The NonProfit Times*’ list of the “Top 50 Power and Influence Leaders,” but beyond power and influence, she built her legacy on the pillars of devotion, compassion, advocacy, and humble service. “Time is short, and the cries of earth and her suffering poor are shrill,” Sister Donna told her LCWR sisters. “No matter what the cost, we respond to these suffering people and these suffering situations. These experiences strip the noise away, from touching into the very heart of The Gospel. I’m no longer afraid of what may become of me in speaking the truth or doing what I know to be right.”

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

James J. Berchtold '63

Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa
Santa Monica, California

Jim Berchtold '63 says he has often thought of himself as a “quiet influencer,” and indeed the impact of his mentorship, his philanthropy, and his leadership have changed the lives of so many University of Portland students and the life of the University of Portland institution itself. He grew up in Mount Angel, OR, where he learned the values of faith, community, and hard work. During harvesting seasons, he'd be out in the fields picking strawberries, beans, and hops, and when his father ran the local creamery, Jim worked in the plant making cheese and butter. At UP, a place that he felt expanded his worldview, he majored in finance and became a member of the Upsilon Omega Pi fraternity. He loved the community and his professors, and it was at UP where he met his late wife Marg '63, with whom he raised two wonderful children. During his 31-year career at U.S. Bank, he made it a priority to mentor those coming up in the ranks, and he continued his connections to his hometown roots by serving as chairman of the board for Mt. Angel Telephone Company, an independent telephone company, co-founded by his grandfather, offering communication services to rural America. When he retired as senior vice president at U.S. Bank, he turned his mentoring

efforts and his interest in entrepreneurship back toward his alma mater. He was president and executive director of the Oregon Entrepreneurs Forum and later co-founded UP's Center for Entrepreneurship. He made strategic introductions between UP and the Portland business community, securing funding for E-Scholars' projects and scholarships, and he attended two of the E-Scholars' trips abroad. By this time Jim had married Amy Dundon-Berchtold. Together, through their shared passion for ethical business practices and their deep connection with members of the Congregation of Holy Cross, they endowed the Dundon-Berchtold Institute for Moral Formation & Applied Ethics, which offers classes and funds independent studies and internships to students from any discipline focusing on applied ethics. Through their philanthropy, the University's state-of-the-art academic center, Dundon-Berchtold Hall, also became a reality in 2019. In 2023, Jim announced an \$18 million estate gift that will primarily fund scholarships and tuition assistance for future UP students. He is now a member of University of Portland's Board of Regents. The University of Portland is grateful for his leadership, generosity, and vision.

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

Andrew Mendenhall '94

Doctor of Public Service, Honoris Causa
Portland, Oregon

Andrew Mendenhall '94, M.D., D.A.B.P.M., D.A.B.F.M., F.A.S.A.M., is the President and CEO of Central City Concern, an organization in Portland that's working to end homelessness by treating the whole person. He joined CCC in 2017 as Senior Medical Director for Substance Use Disorder Services, and became Chief Medical Officer in 2018. Mendenhall trained as a family physician at OHSU and went on to work at Providence Health Systems and CleanSlate Centers. He co-founded an outpatient integrated treatment program called HealthWorks NW, which was acquired by Hazelden Betty Ford in 2012. Mendenhall's practice has always been rooted in service work to the most vulnerable members of the Portland metropolitan region, who are also the most resilient. "I'm a Population Health nerd at heart," Mendenhall says. "I want to close gaps for vulnerable members of our community, change the stories of their lives, and transform the way they engage in society." Mendenhall's dedication to serving people experiencing homelessness dates back to his freshman year on The Bluff, in 1991. One Friday evening, he volunteered to lead a group of his hallmates on an impromptu meals-on-wheels expedition. They rented a van, grabbed 150 pounds of spaghetti and

meatballs and garlic bread from The Commons, and delivered the hefty bags of food to Transition Projects downtown. This turned into a semi-regular event during his time on campus, and he even got other dorms involved, too. During these outings, Mendenhall became aware of the myriad ways our systems fail those in need, whether that was in physical or mental healthcare, housing and shelter, or addiction. And in his medical practice, he was shocked and disheartened to find a pervasive stigma against providing treatment to this vulnerable population, so much so that he changed the course of his career. "It's critical to humanize everyone," Mendenhall says. "To treat people with love and respect." In his role at the helm of CCC, Mendenhall has found a perch to match his life's passion. CCC's golden thread is helping a person navigate the complex and daunting steps back into society, toward a place of rehabilitation, and it achieves this without a whiff of stigma. In addition to the many services they provide, they also work to influence and inform good policy decisions. "We're a national model for what communities should be doing," Mendenhall says of CCC. "But it's going to take time for this region to build the services we need. We have to be courageously patient."

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

The Honorable Adrienne C. Nelson

Doctor of Public Service, Honoris Causa
Portland, Oregon

Judge Adrienne C. Nelson's first legal interaction came as a high school senior, when she earned the honor of valedictorian because she had the highest GPA in her class, only to find out administrators planned to give that distinction to another student instead. Her mom sued the school district and won, but that alone was not what sowed the seeds of her legal profession. It was how her family and community rallied to support her, teaching her the importance of faith, hope, and service—lessons that would guide her pioneering career as the second African American woman to become a judge in Oregon's history in 2006, the first African American justice on the Oregon State Supreme Court in 2018, and in 2023 the first African American woman to serve on the U.S. District Court in Oregon. "I chose to go into the law because it was a way for me to help others," says Nelson. "I wanted to do something to make the world better." After earning her law degree from the University of Texas School of Law at Austin, she moved to Oregon in 1994 and began her career as a public defender before practicing in the private sector. With mentorship

from Mercedes Deiz, the first Black woman admitted to the Oregon State Bar and the first woman of color to be an Oregon judge, she found her calling on the bench. "I never considered being a judge. She was the one who planted that seed," says Nelson. Law has given Nelson a platform to work for fairness and justice, where her faith in humanity can make a difference. "I believe the legal system should reflect the people it serves," she says. "I think my ability to see people beyond what they've done helped me be a better lawyer and now a better judge. I don't want anyone to not be seen and heard in my courtroom." Over the years, Nelson has given countless hours of service and leadership to a wide range of Oregon non profits, earning a long list of accolades along the way. But perhaps the most meaningful came in 2021, when Adrienne C. Nelson High School opened. These days, that's where she focuses most of her work outside the courtroom. "I'm grateful to be able to show up for the students and let them know that they matter," she says. "I hope they find value and inspiration in my journey."

CANDIDATES FOR DEGREES

Reynold Verret, Ph.D.

Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa
New Orleans, Louisiana

Reynold Verret, PhD, is the sixth president and second lay leader of Xavier University of Louisiana, the nation's only Catholic HBCU. Before accepting this position in 2015, he served as the provost at Savannah State University and Wilkes University, where he launched successful initiatives to build enrollment, enhance the quality and diversity of academic programs, and promote interdisciplinary efforts between the humanities and the sciences. His career is an ongoing testament to resilience and the liberating power of education. "Education is a foundation on which we build and strengthen society," Dr. Verret says. "Broad education leads to engaged citizens, essential to a democratic government. Education also brings forth the talent and creativity to build economies, healthy societies, and to secure the future." Originally from Haiti, Dr. Verret grew up in a time of social and political unrest. When he was eight years old, his mother, a nurse, was arrested by soldiers looking for husband, a physician. He recalls the persistent squeal of sirens and seeing bodies lying lifeless in the street. A kind stranger hid Verret and his siblings for a week, until the worst of the unrest had passed and their mother was released. Four months later, they were able to emigrate to the United States, where they ended up in New York. Such havoc is hard for a person of any age

to endure, but is particularly challenging for one so young. And the experience, as well as the unwavering support from his family, encouraged Verret to cultivate a tremendous work ethic. After attending a Jesuit high school in Brooklyn, Verret earned a B.A. from Columbia University and a Ph.D. from MIT, both in biochemistry. As an immunologist, Dr. Verret studied the functions of immune cells and the fundamental properties of biological membranes. He has published over two dozen scientific articles on various biochemical research. Throughout his academic career, he has worked hard to increase the number of students, especially those from underrepresented groups, pursuing degrees in STEM disciplines. As the president of Xavier, Verret is committed to promoting a more just and humane society by identifying and nurturing the individual gifts of its students, preparing them for roles of leadership and service, a mission he finds immensely rewarding. "Our purpose is to prepare young people to be agents of change, agents of service, and agents of goodness," he says. "I am able to facilitate and make possible the success of many bright, young people. Seeing the faces of students living with purpose and achieving their goals—there's nothing more satisfying as an educator."

The University's History

A Brief History of the University

Tradition has it that when Reverend Alexander Christie was appointed Archbishop of Portland in 1898, he had a vision for a university. While traveling aboard a ship along the Willamette River, Christie noticed a large brick building atop Waud's Bluff. When he learned that it was the site of the defunct Portland University founded by the Methodist Episcopal Church in 1891, Christie decided to purchase it (with financial assistance from the Congregation of Holy Cross) for the school of his vision. He named it "Columbia University" after the mighty river, and when it opened its doors on September 5, 1901, it was staffed with priests from the archdiocese. Christie realized that his school needed more support, so he approached the Congregation of Holy Cross's Indiana Province, and the following September they assumed ownership. Christie's vision had special meaning to the C.S.C.s. In 1841 several members of their order traveled from France to Indiana, where they founded the University of Notre Dame. Their success assured Christie that his own vision would one day be realized. In 1925, the College of Arts and Sciences was founded. In the 1930s, the University's name was changed to the University of Portland, the St. Vincent Hospital School of Nursing joined the University as the College of Nursing, and the

School of Business was created. In 1948, the School of Engineering was created, followed by the Graduate School in 1950 and the School of Education in 1962. In 1967 the Congregation of Holy Cross order transferred ownership of the University to a lay Board of Regents.

Today, UP is Oregon's largest private and the state's only Catholic university. It also is Oregon's only comprehensive university with schools of business, education, engineering, nursing, a College of Arts and Sciences, and a graduate school. There are more than 40 undergraduate programs and 30 minors, as well as 18 graduate programs, and more than 1,300 courses. For 28 consecutive years, the University has earned a top-10 ranking by *US News & World Report* in the "Regional Universities – West" classification, including the number 1 spot in the 2022 rankings. For nine consecutive years, UP has been the top Oregon school in *Kiplinger's Personal Finance* annual ranking of best values in private universities. And for three consecutive years, *Bloomberg Businessweek* has named University of Portland the top school in Oregon for "return on investment" in a state-by-state ranking of schools providing graduates with the most return for the price of their education.

The University's Mission and Alumni

The University's Mission

The University of Portland, an independently governed Catholic university guided by the Congregation of Holy Cross, addresses significant questions of human concern through studies of the arts, sciences, and humanities. As a diverse community of scholars dedicated to excellence and innovation, we pursue teaching and learning, faith and formation, service and leadership in the classroom, residence halls, and the world. Because we value the development of the whole person, the University honors faith and reason as ways of knowing, promotes ethical reflection, and prepares people who respond to the needs of the world and its human family.

The Coat of Arms

The historic green shield of the University of Portland bears a silver cross moline and crossed anchors. Beneath the cross and anchors are six wavy bars of silver and blue, and an open book with gold clasps. This is an adaptation of the arms of the Congregation of Holy Cross and the city of Portland. The motto, *Veritas vos liberabit* ("The truth will set you free") is on an escroll under the shield. Flanking the coat of arms are oak and laurel, symbols of strength and success.

Chain of Office

The President's Chain of Office is the symbol of unity the university forges from its diverse communities. Six medallions represent the major constituencies of the University: the State of Oregon, the Alumni, the Students, the Faculty, the Congregation of Holy Cross, and the Board of Regents. Tying them together is the heptagon displaying the symbol of the City of Roses and Mt. Hood. Rising over Mt. Hood is the Morning Star, symbolic of Mary, Mother of the Word Incarnate, patroness of the University. The heptagon is also representative of the Trivium and the Quadrivium, the curricula of the medieval university. At the bottom of the chain is the Coat of Arms of the University of Portland. The connecting links are cast in the shape of roots and branches of the rose.

The Brother Godfrey Vassallo, C.S.C., Memorial Mace

The ceremonial mace is a traditional emblem at institutions of higher learning in academic processions. At the University of Portland, a mace made of polished myrtle wood with bronze trim was commissioned in honor of Brother Godfrey, who served as Grand Marshal for many years. It was used for the first time at the 75th commencement in 1977. The cross at the top symbolizes the founding of the University as a Christian institution. Metal plates bear the names of all University of Portland presidents and the name of the mace.

The Christus Magister Medal

The Christus Magister Medal is awarded annually to men and women of international distinction. Recipients have evinced a vigorous spiritual life and an accomplished career that has significantly advanced knowledge, been of inimitable service to humanity, and been an inspiration and consolation to the world. It is the University's highest honor, conferred upon those whose lives have illustrated and enhanced the University's mission.

Academic Dress and Procession

The history of academic dress dates back to the Middle Ages when many of the scholars were also clerics and wore the costume of the monastic orders. In 1321, the University of Cambridge adopted specific styles and color combinations for its faculties.

American colleges and universities desired to adopt a standard code of academic dress, and at a conference held at Columbia University in 1895, representatives from various institutions adopted a code and regulations governing academic dress for colleges and universities in the United States. The standards continue to be followed by the American Council on Education.

The costumes worn today are all traditional and their colors, trimmings, and patterns interpret the degree, the field of learning, and the institution that conferred the degree. The type of degree (bachelor's, master's, doctor's) is indicated by the width of the velvet edging and the length of the hood, the doctor's hood being the longest and of fuller shape than the others. The color of the velvet edging denotes the field of learning and the colors of the lining denote the school which conferred the degree.

The color of the tassel, worn on the left side of the mortarboard, also indicates the field of study and is gold for those with doctor's degrees. The colors you will see today in the hoods and gowns of our faculty represent the various fields of learning:

white, Arts, Letters and Humanities;
drab, Business;
light blue, Education;
orange, Engineering;
brown, Fine Arts;
purple, Law;
lemon yellow, Library Science;
pink, Music;
apricot, Nursing;
dark blue, Philosophy;
golden yellow, Science;
scarlet, Theology.

The academic procession is led by the Marshals, faculty members appointed by the Provost. A traditional order of procession is followed: First come the candidates for degrees according to the order in which the degrees are to be conferred, then members of the faculty, and finally, the honorary degree recipients and the members of the platform party, followed by the President and Chair of the Board of Regents of the University. The order is reversed for the recessional.
