What is the E-Scholars Program?

The Entrepreneur Scholars Program (E-Scholars) is a campus-wide, innovative program to help you design and implement a world-class venture — to achieve something you have only, at this point, dreamed of doing. The mission of the program is to enable high potential students to transform entrepreneurial ideas into reality. E-Scholar alums reach higher levels of success than they ever imagined possible.

The E-Scholars Program is limited to 25 students each year and is open to students from all disciplines. The program is made possible through individual and corporate sponsorships for each student. The sponsor contributions assist with tuition and travel expenses for the E-Scholars Program. Each E-Scholar also pays a program fee for this unique experience that combines the classroom with international travel and opportunities to meet world-class entrepreneurs.

The E-Scholars Program has received the Innovation and Creative Education Award from the Academy of Educational Leadership, as well as the National Model Specialty Entrepreneurship Program Award from the United States Association for Small Business and Entrepreneurship.

Leadership

Robin Anderson, the Robert W. Franz Chair in Entrepreneurship, created and leads the E-Scholars Program. Under Dr. Anderson's guidance the University of Portland is nationally ranked for its entrepreneurial programs.

The Courses in the Program

Creating a World-Class Venture (BUS 480):

You will work independently and in groups to develop your ideas and create your venture. The structure of the E-Scholars Program guides you from the inception of a business idea to its creation and implementation. You will meet with top experts in the field related to your new venture to gain further information and insight on how to successfully approach venture creation.

Your learning plan will be based on your strengths and will focus directly on your business idea. Examples include networking with business leaders who can assist in the promotion of the business idea, researching best practices and current trends in the industry, attending trade conferences, and further developing your business plan and market research.

The Entrepreneur Apprenticeship (BUS 481):

During this phase of the E-Scholars Program, you will transform your business ideas into a working entity with the help of business mentors, through a structured apprenticeship.

Global Entrepreneurship (BUS 482):

The program includes a trip outside of the United States to give you the opportunity to experience how new businesses are created in other countries. You will choose your destination and make your own business appointments. You will learn and practice entrepreneurship across borders.

E-Scholar Destinations

Past international experiences have included business trips to Australia, Brazil, Chile, China, Korea, Israel, Malaysia, Poland, Russia, Singapore, South Africa, United Arab Emirates, Ukraine, and Vietnam. Past national trips have included visits to meet entrepreneurs in New York City; San Antonio, Texas; Washington D.C.; and Chicago, Illinois.

When to Apply

It is best to apply in your sophomore year, but you may also apply in your junior year.
