Student's Behavior/Presenting Issue		Response/Resource
Demonstrates evidence of imminent harm to self or others		Call Public Safety at 503-943-4444
Displays evidence of suicidal-ideation or is displaying other distressing behavioral signs		Call Public Safety at 503-943-4444 or call the Health and Counseling Center at 503-943-7134; after hours, contact ProtoCall at 503-943-7134, option 3. And, submit an Early Alert Report at up.edu/earlyalert
Shows signs of emotional distress/mental health-related issues but not necessitating immediate attention		Call the Health and Counseling Center at 503-943-7134; after hours, contact ProtoCall at 503-943-7134, option 3. Submit an Early Alert Report at up.edu/earlyalert
Makes you or others feel unsafe		If there is an imminent concern, contact Public Safety at 503-943-4444 and/or 911. If there is no immediate danger/threat, submit an Early Alert at up.edu/earlyalert
Indicates student has experienced sexual or gender-based harassment, misconduct, discrimination and/or violence, including stalking or domestic violence (including incidents prior to UP)		Call or consult with Title IX at 503-943-8982. Submit a Title IX report at up.edu/tleix
Indicates student is experiencing bias, discrimination or harassment (that is not sex or gender based)		Contact Student Conduct at 503-943-7818 or up.edu/residencelife/student-conduct
Behaves inappropriately or disrupts class		Implement standard classroom management techniques. Address the concern with your Department Chair, if applicable
Has excessive or extended class absences without communication		Submit an Early Alert Report at up.edu/earlyalert
Is struggling with study skills, time management, or specific courses		Contact the Shepard Academic Resource Center at 503-943-7895 or up.edu/sarc
Reports or shows sign of disability impacting learning or classroom environment		Contact Accessible Education Services at 503-943-8985 or up.edu/aes

Reports housing or food insecurity concerns		Submit an Early Alert Report at up.edu/earlyalert
