Financial aid can help cover the costs of study abroad including tuition, fees, housing & meals, airfare, health insurance, in-country travel, and books. File a FAFSA for maximum aid eligibility.

Institutional Study Abroad

Programs hosted and run through UP are eligible for all types of federal, state, and institutional financial aid (except tuition exchange).

IES Study Abroad

UP has a partial consortium agreement with IES. Therefore, only federal and state aid may be used for most IES programs.

Other Study Abroad

Other programs are not eligible for financial aid through UP. Check with the host institution to see if you are eligible for aid.
